At Cattail Creek Farm in Howard County, MD, 400 acres of farmland that could have been developed were fortunately preserved and transformed into a finely sculpted estate. Jay Graham and Kevin Campion, landscape architects of Graham Landscape Architecture, captured and preserved the beauty of the countryside, saving natural ecosystems as they worked. They recommended fields for meadows and farming, designed lovely terraced fountains, garden walls, arched gates, and a grotto that cascades into an ornamental pool to complement the undulating property.
